The Resort is approximately 8 miles northwest of the Hood Canal floating bridge, and about 20 miles south of Port Townsend. The spacious grounds of the Resort are situated on a secluded inlet of Puget Sound. Registration will begin at 3:30 Friday, May 6, and will be followed by a social hour at 6:00, banquet at 7:30, after dinner speaker at 8:30, and talks on Saturday morning.

We still have room on the agenda for a couple more presentations, so give us a call if you are interested.


The total price of \$60 per person includes banquet dinner Friday, breakfast and lunch Saturday, lodging Friday night (double occupancy), and the use of various conference facilities such as the conference center, the recreation center (table tennis, pool, table games), tennis courts, and one squash court. There is also a outstanding golf course at the Resort; for reservations call Seattle direct 622-9544.

You can easily find the Resort; simply follow the signs to Port Ludlow and the Resort after driving across the Hood Canal bridge. Here are a few other travel tips especially intended for those making a longer trip from eastern Washington. If you are coming via I-90, you should save about 45 minutes travel time by taking the Seattle-Winslow ferry rather than the Seattle-Bremerton run. If you think you will arrive in the Seattle area after 4PM (approx.) Friday, you will encounter both commuter traffic and probable ferry overloads. To avoid this delay, I suggest the following route which does not use any ferries: Take exit 25 off I-90 and follow Hwy. 18 to I-5; follow I-5 south and take exit 132 leading to the Tacoma Narrows bridge; follow Hwy. 16 and Hwy. 3 north up the Kitsap Peninsula to the Hood Canal bridge.

Other travel options: from south of Olympia take Hwy. 101 and avoid the \$2.50 toll on the Hood Canal bridge; from Hwy. 2 (Stevens Pass) take the Edmonds-Kingston ferry; from north of Mt. Vernon take the Keystone-Pt. Townsend ferry. I have enclosed ferry schedules. The times in these schedules should be quite similar to those in the spring schedule coming out in mid-April. You can verify times by calling 1-800-542-0810 or 1-800-542-7052.
